

**First International Congress “Silenced Writings in the Time of Cervantes”
Alcalá de Henares, Spain November 29th/30th to December 1st 2005.**

The University of Alcalá, Spain, invites scholars interested in taking part in an interdisciplinary encounter which will focus on the studies of the forbidden, censored, silenced and destroyed texts during the period of Cervantes (16th and 17th Centuries). Amongst the important subjects to be discussed, the recently discovered polemical Miccinelli or Napoles documents. Since Alcalá was the heart of the production of the main “silenced” documents of that period, it is considered important and at the same time urgent to convoke this academic reunion in order to discuss, in this historical city, the latest advances related to this subject.

Those interested in participating are invited to present abstracts regarding these subjects by October 15th:

- 1) In the frontiers of America and Europe.
- 2) Forbidden writings: Miccinelli documents and others.
- 3) “Informaciones”, forgery and re-writings.
- 4) Coded writings and paratexts.
- 5) Conversion, Indigenous languages and academics.
